The Board of Supervisors met in adjourned session April 14, 2025, 9 a.m. Members present were Chair Devlun Whiteing, Creston Schubert and Kyle Rohlk.

Whiteing called the meeting to order.

Minutes from April 1, 2025, were approved. Moved by Whiteing, seconded by Schubert. Motion carried, all voting Aye.

Conservation Director, Wyatt Reitmeier and Dan Hedberg from parks; updated the board on current projects, including natural prairie grass at Crawford Creek and re-stocking both Crawford Creek and Moorehead Park this fall with walleye and trout. They asked the board if they would consider letting conservation keep some funds from their camping revenues so they are able to continue making updates. Their goal is bring more people to Ida County to enjoy our facilities. The board will look into this and let them know what we are able to do.

County Engineer, Jeff Williams updated the board on his state budget/projects for the next 1-5 years. A motion to approve Dan Roeder's request, Silver Creek 20, to fill in a ditch to make mowing easier was made by Whiteing, seconded by Rohlk. Motion carried all voting Aye.

A motion by Schubert to approve Diamond Vogel Traffic Services to paint, county wide, road lines seconded by Rohlk. Motion carried all voting Aye. Motion to approve right of way permit for Northwest REC, Blaine 23, by Schubert, seconded by Rohlk. Motion carried all voting Aye.

At 10:25 Schubert made a motion to open the public hearing for consideration of the FY26 Budget. Rohlk seconded. Motion carried all voting Aye. No one from the public was present for this hearing. At 10:26 a motion to close the public hearing was made by Rohlk, seconded by Schubert. Motion carried all voting Aye. Motion to approve Resolution 25-16, Approval of FY26 Budget by Whiteing, seconded by Schubert. Motion carried all voting Aye. A motion to approve Resolution 25-17, Elected Officials Salaries for FY26 by Rohlk, seconded by Schubert. Motion carried all voting Aye.

County Recorder, Julie Phillips met with the board to discuss backing up her records with Cott. The board approved \$5,000 from data processing fund to help with this. Motion by Whiteing, seconded by Rohlk. Motion carried all voting Aye. A motion to approve Recorder Clerk, Marcus Prell to \$23.25 per hour effective 04/14/25 by Whiteing, seconded by Schubert. DEFINITIONS

- Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) -- The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.
- ppb -- parts per billion.
- ppm -- parts per million.
- pCi/L - picocuries per liter
- NIA- Not applicable
- ND -- Not detected
- RAA - Running Annual Average
- Treatment Technique (TT) -A reqHired process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.
- Action Level (AL) - The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.
- Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do

not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

- Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The Dakota-Mississippian well will have low susceptibility to surface contaminants such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills, and excess fertilizer application.
